February International Notes

The January newsletter discussed leadership opportunities primarily in the Michigan area. We will discuss the Constitutional Area Forums this month. Every September the United States and Canada come together to host the **USA/Canada Forum**, the 2012 Forum to be held in Tampa Bay, Florida. Many of you had the opportunity to either attend or work on the

Forum that was held in Grand Rapids and if you didn't get to do either then you will have another chance as Grand Rapids was chosen for the 2015 event. Mark your calendars, time goes faster than ever.

The Lions of Europe host their own session called the EUROPA Forum held in various areas of Europe. I have attended two of them, both in Italy, Rome and Bologna. While there are indeed educational events planned, the Forum does also serve as a political forum as well.

The next scheduled forum is for the countries of the Asia Pacific Area and is called the OSEAL Forum. I have attended two of these as well, one in Manila, Philippines and in Kaohsiung, Taiwan. These forums lean more toward the necessary politics as a vast area with many countries are included.

The forum usually held in December is called the ISAAME Forum and consists of India, South Asia, Africa and the Middle East. This forum is the most like our USA/Canada in that many different seminars are held but the politics of the area definitely gets covered. There has been some ongoing talks about Africa hosting its own forum but may be years away. I have been to two of these forums as well, the first in Ahmadabad, India and in December Kathleen and I attended in Dubai, U.A.E.

The last of the original forums is held south of our borders and is the FOLAC Forum, covering Central & South America as well as the countries of the Caribbean. I have been to the one in Cartagena, Columbia and we were on our way to Lima, Peru in January but got iced in so spent a couple of days in Atlanta trying to get back to Michigan.

Last year was the first forum held "down under" and will be repeated yearly, this being the ANZI Forum. It includes Australia, New Zealand and Indonesia as well as the South Pacific islands. It was patterned very closely after the USA/Canada forum. The forum was held in Australia and I believe the 2012 forum will be in New Zealand.

I write this column obviously because it is of interest to me and it is my hope that by reading this you will not only develop an overview of Lions Internationally but come to appreciate the worldwide effort our Association has for leadership training and the opportunities given for this training. More next month on what is happening internationally, please let me know if this column is of any benefit or perhaps it should go in another direction.

January 17, 2012

Program - Board of Directors Meeting

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:52 PM by the president with the following members present:

President Hoppa, 2nd VP Hansen, 3rd VP Krol, Treasurer Wolffis, Tail Twister K. Cobler, Lion Tamer Margules, Membership Chair Larson, Directors Bradfield, Loughrige and Weessies. Absent and excused were Secretary O'Lonergan and Director Anne Schalow.

2. Additions or corrections to the agenda - Under item 5 (Reports); D - 3rd VP Krol - Add nomination of Lion Douglas Schneider to the office of First Vice District Governor.

3. A motion to approve the minutes of the 12/20/2011 Board meeting was made by Director Loughrige, seconded by 3rd VP Krol. No discussion. Motion approved.

4. A motion to approve the treasurer's reports, subject to audit, was made by Director Weessies, seconded by 2nd VP Hansen. No Discussion. Motion approved.

5. Reports:

a. President Hoppa:

1. The committee report form has been revised to make reporting activities to Lions International easier.

2. Appointment of a First Vice President to fill the remainder of Lion Bates' term. A motion to appoint Lion Wendell Bradfield to the office of First Vice president was made by Director Weessies, Seconded by Treasurer Wolffis. Discussion - Lion Bradfield accepted the appointment. Motion approved.

b. First Vice President Bradfield:

1. Kid Sight Program - Lion Cheryl Schneider gave an overview on the Kids Sight program and the use of the new digital cameras.

2. Causeway Lights - Most of the lights have been taken down. Rest will be taken down when weather improves. It was suggested that we budget for the use of a high lift. It was noted that there are funds available. Lion Hansen will be scheduling work session at his home to organize and put the lights away.

c. Second Vice President Hansen:

1. It was noted that we received a donation from the Indiana Lions in the amount of \$750.00 for all of the used glasses we have given to them over the years. The donation was deposited in the Administration Fund. Lion Secretary O'Lonergan sent them a "Thank You."

d. Third Vice President Krol:

1. Lion Krol discussed the Michigan Forum that will be held in Lansing on February 18, 2012.

2. A request by Lion Weessies to have Lion Dreikorn become the Registered Agent for our two corporations and to do the annual filings for the corporations as well as the annual filing for permission to solicit with MI Attorney General's office. Lion Weessies explained the functions and that he has done it since the corporations were established. He stated he would act as back up for Lion Dreikorn. A motion to approve the request was made by Lion K. Cobler, seconded by 2nd VP Bradfield. No discussion. Motion approved.

3. It is proposed by Secretary O'Lonergan that at the present time the meal costs be \$204.00 per year, \$51.00 per quarter or \$9.00 per meal. Potential members are given one free meal and all other guests other than Youth Exchange students are \$9.00. The exception to this amount is when there is a special event. In addition, there will be a two member team made up of Lions Dreikorn and Weessies who will take attendance and collect dues as members arrive. A motion to approve this proposal was made by Treasurer Wolffis, seconded by Director Loughrige. There was a question dealing with the exchange students. Motion approved.

4. A motion to approve the membership of Eric Strait was made by 2nd VP Hansen, seconded by Director Loughrige. Motion Approved. Lion nominee Strait has attended two meetings and went through the required pre-induction orientation and will be formally inducted at our February 7th meeting.

5. It is with honor that the Muskegon Northside Lions Club submits the name of Lion Douglas Schneider for nomination for the office of First Vice District Governor of District 11

C1. Said nomination was made by Tail Twister K. Cobler, seconded by 2nd VP Hansen. Motion was approved. Once again our club will provide quality leadership to the district and the Lions of Michigan.

The Board meeting was adjourned at 8:35 P.M.

This Lion is also a voting member of the Board of Directors.

The Secret Greeter - This Lion is chosen to greet members as they arrive to the meeting. Prior to the start of the meeting the Secret Greeter is to select a number that reflects a Lion who greeted them with a handshake before the start of the meeting.

Beginning in January and running through April, the program for the second meeting of the month will be the Board of Directors meeting. All members are strongly encouraged to stay and take part where appropriate. If you have not been attending and are not out of town you do not know what you are missing. Besides good food and good programs you are missing times with folks who do miss you. Of course we miss our members who have traveled to warmer climates too but for those of you who are braving the Michigan weather we sure would like to share your company. Dues. This was covered last month but just in case you missed it. At the last International Convention the Lions of the world approved a four dollar (\$4.00) dues increase. These increases will be included in your annual administrative dues assessment beginning July 1, 2012 (\$78.00). The next dues increase will be July 1, 2013 (\$80). At this time there are no dues increases being proposed by the state, district or the club.

Meal Costs. For those who pay each time they attend the cost for the meal will be \$9.00. You are asked to see Lions Roger Dreikorn or Ed Weessies as soon as you arrive as they will be taking attendance and collecting the meal cost. Third quarter meal expenses of \$51.00 were due January 3, 2012.

I stated that it was with pride (and it was) that I was able to add Eric. Not just because he was joining us in Lions service but because of his youth and enthusiasm. I replied that as a Charter Member, I represented our club's past but our younger members represent our future. That is not to say that our members who are over 50 are not as important as our younger members. No one is better than anyone else, just different. Our senior members do a lot of the things our younger members cannot do because of family and employment constraints. We must also provide to our younger members the guidance and history that is necessary for the success of our club as well as that of Lions in general. We senior members have an obligation to inspire our younger members to serve not just our community but to serve our club, our district, our state and even Lions International.

Well I have started something that is way out of my comfort zone. By this I mean the vice presidents' job. But then we all should be stepping up to help our club in any way that we can.

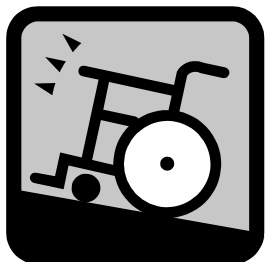
